#### Resolution taken by BOG:

Director, BIT Sindri, apprised the BOG about the visit of Director IIT (ISM) Dhanbad regarding twinning activity in connection with SIEMENS Labs. Director, Technical Education suggested that in view of the termination of

SIEMENS contract, in house expertise be developed for manning and maintaining the labs through the engagement of two faculty members for each lab as Professor In-charge. He further suggested that semi-skilled persons from the locality be engaged for training jobs like painting, welding etc. in the Siemens Labs.

Mr. B. Baranwal emphasized about in-house trainer development facilities, provision for published documents for ease in functioning and follow-up by Professor In-charges to facilitate their activity. Assessment of level of appreciation of the concern jobs be undertaken by the trainees. The Chairman, BOG, Mr. B. Baranwal & Director, BIT Sindri suggested for the provision of AMC of the concerned machines/ equipments and sought help of Director, Technical Education, Jharkhand in this matter. It was further suggested by them that AMC support may be sought from Siemens as well as the concerned OEMs. Mrs. K. Sharma suggested about the establishment of liasoning centres at wellconnected places like metropolitan cities such as Kolkata, Bangalore etc. It was further suggested that a faculty member be placed "under deputation" for functioning as the Liasoning Officer. His /her job will be to identify and collaborate with those companies that would be helping the students of the institute in preparing them for industry readiness. Companies like IBM, Microsoft, SAP etc. should be contacted. In this regard, negotiation may be initiated for upgrading and establishing laboratories, developing internship program and thereby improve in placement of students.
